

2019 Central Florida Community Health Needs Assessment

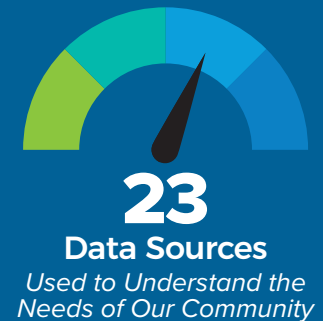

The ultimate goal is to develop strategies to improve the health of uninsured residents across our community in Lake, Orange, Osceola and Seminole counties.

Top Concerns

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Food Security
Nearly one-third of people in our region say they lack access to high quality, affordable, healthy food.
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Mental and Behavioral Health
More than 58% of respondents say they are hopeless or depressed
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Chronic Diseases
Nearly one in four respondents identified cardiovascular disease, asthma and/or cancer as a problem for them or a family member.
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Communicable Diseases
Over one fourth of survey respondents (regardless of county) have experienced influenza or pneumonia
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Preventative Care
Over 45% of respondents report challenges accessing affordable health care.
