Community Health Needs Assessment Process

Park Ridge Health (The Hospital) conducted a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) in 2016. The Assessment identified the health-related needs of community including low-income, minority, and medically underserved populations.

In order to assure broad community input, Park Ridge Health participated in a regional Community Health Needs Assessment Committee (CHNAC) the guided multiple community partners including the Hospital through the Assessment and Community Health Plan process. The Committee included representation not only from the Hospital, public health and the broad community, but from low-income, minority and other underserved populations.

The Committee met throughout 2016 and early 2017. The members reviewed the primary and secondary data, reviewed the initial priorities identified in the Assessment, considered the priorityrelated Assets already in place in the community, used specific criteria to select the specific Priority Issues to be addressed by the Hospital, and helped develop this Community Health Plan (implementation strategy) to address the Priority Issues.

This Community Health Plan lists targeted interventions and measurable outcome statements for each Priority Issue noted below. It includes the resources the Hospital will commit to the Plan, and notes any planned collaborations between the Hospital and other community organizations and hospitals.

Priority Issues that will be addressed by Park Ridge Health

Park Ridge Health will address the following Priority Issues in 2017-2019:

- 1. Access/Quality of Mental Health Services: The Committee expressed concerns that the region's behavioral health system is not effectively equipped to meet growing mental health needs. Emergency rooms, jails and first responders are often overwhelmed by mental health patients with limited options for short or long term treatment. Area social service agencies continue to report increased rates of clients with unmet mental illness needs.
- 2. Substance Abuse: The Committee recognized that area Hospitals, healthcare providers and first responders continue to experience increases in opioid-related visits and overdoses. The issue of substance abuse—particularly prescription drug abuse—impacts all facets of the community from law enforcement to area schools and workforce development.

- 3. Obesity: Obesity has consistently been a top community health need in the region. Improved nutrition and increased physical activity continue to be the focus for this health priority. Recognizing that being overweight is major risk factor for chronic disease, the Committee is committed to helping prevent heart disease, diabetes, hypertension and cancer by promoting a healthier diet and more active lifestyle.
- 4. Safe and Affordable Housing: The Committee was committed to identifying and addressing a social determinant of health. Affordable housing was the topic most frequently discussed during the Community Health Needs Assessment process. Participants from community leaders to members of focus groups and client interviews consistently cited high housing costs and limited workforce housing as a major health concerns in the region.

Issues that will not be addressed by Park Ridge Health

The 2016 Community Health Needs Assessment also identified the follow community health issues that Park Ridge Health will not address. The list below includes these issues and an explanation of why the Hospital is not addressing them:

- Transportation: The Committee was committed to including a "social determinant" of health in the final set of key health priorities. While both affordable housing and transportation are both important, the community and committee selected safe affordable housing as its focus. An existing community task force will continue its work to address transportation needs in the region.
- Intimate Partner Violence: The Committee believed that Intimate Partner Violence could be effectively addressed under the broader headings of Access to Mental Health Services and Substance Abuse.
- Chronic Disease Prevention/Diabetes: Chronic Disease Prevention has consistently been a health priority in the region as a result of past county-wide Community Health Assessments. The community has effectively responded to these needs and formed ongoing committees and collaborative efforts to sustain its efforts to address these issues.
- Suicide: The local CHNAC believed that the issue of suicide could be more effective addressed under the broader community needs of access to mental health services and substance abuse.
- Youth Violence/Bullying: The local CHNAC did not select this issue as a priority likely because area school systems are committed to engaging the community to address this issue.

Board Approval

The Park Ridge Health Board formally approved the specific Priority Issues and the full Community Health Needs Assessment in 2016. The Board also approved this Community Health Plan.

Ongoing Evaluation

Park Ridge Health's fiscal year is January-December. For 2017, the Community Health Plan will be deployed beginning May 15 and evaluated at the end of the calendar year. In 2018 and beyond, the Plan will be implemented and evaluated at the end of the calendar year. In 2018 and beyond, the Plan will be implemented and evaluated annually for the 12-month period beginning January 1 and ending December 31. Evaluation results will be attached to our IRS Form 990, Schedule H.
